



GRAMMAR NOTES - BATHING DOMAIN

The sentence structure for bathing is the same as the grammar for the other domains that have involved body part suffixes. For example, look at (1). The suffix for ‘back’ is *-ič*, but when followed by a vowel, it becomes *-ij*.

- (1) c’ag^wijəbəx^w čəd.
 c’ag^w -ij -əb -əx^w čəd
 wash **back** self assert I
 ‘I wash my **back**.’
